- **Adult Programs:** Medicaid for low income adults ages 19-64 who are not pregnant or are medically disabled.
- **Programs for Children:** The HUSKY Plan offers a full health insurance package for children and teenagers up to age 19, regardless of family income.
- **Medication Programs:** ConnPACE -Connecticut Pharmaceutical Assistance Contract to the Elderly⁷ and Disabled Allows eligible senior citizens and people with disabilities to afford the cost of most prescription medications.
- **Additional Programs:** Charter Oak offers coverage to the uninsured and to many adults experiencing financial hardship in paying unaffordable, non-group premiums on their own. 1-877-77CTOAK.
